VILLA HILLS – The children at Villa Madonna Montessori are getting worldly. In celebration of the Chinese New Year, the preschool and kindergarten classes were treated to a presentation of Chinese food and culture by Northern Kentucky resident Angela Wong.

Wong, whose family owns
Oriental Wok, brought
traditional Chinese clothing,
relics and rice dishes for the
children to enjoy. Wong told
the children all about the
Chinese calendar – this is the
year of the Rooster – and its
tradition of naming each year
after an animal. Wong, who
was born in Hong Kong,
taught the children a few

Chinese words and shared some history about Chinese culture and gave them some laughs with her mini gong.

Kindergarten teachers Patti Birkett and Gail Dwertman helped the children build two large dragon costumes which were paraded into the classroom before the presentation, symbolizing how children in China bring
